



BOOK Article, Subscription Database, or Gale eBooks (in Gale Virtual Reference Library)

- Subscription Databases often include mixed media. Make sure you have chosen the correct medium and worksheet.
- Online subscription database citation information is found at the top or the bottom of the article. (Sometimes this information is found in the results list.)
- Subscription databases rarely supply all of the publication information you need to cite. Skip parts for information not found, with the exception of publishing and page number information both of which require a plug-in.
- The search date goes last and is written in International Date format.

- Creating:**
 - Create or login in to your list in *NoodleBib*
 - Cite a Book (Pull Down Menu)
 - Click Create Citation

 - Change Formatting Options, if necessary
 - Click “Open and Print” hyperlink to see text file
 - Click on “Click Here” hyperlink if you want to save file
