



Book, Entire eBook (In Follett OPAC)

- Do not use this format when the eBook you are using is alphabetically arranged or has a different author for each part. In such cases, use the **Worksheet: Book, Subscription Database, or Gale eBooks**
- MLA Rule: Cite resources that were previously published in print and then re-published on the Internet using the MLA parts for the original printed medium. The Title of Website/Database and URL are added to reference the Internet version.
- The URL was omitted in the sample citation below. It was very long and had an unreasonable amount of un-meaningful characters.
- MLA examples and rules made it unclear as to where the supplemental series title would be placed in this citation. Your librarian made placement decision based on an MLA printed book in a series format.
