



Magazine Article

- Many periodical articles do not provide the author's name. Omit the author of unsigned articles in periodical citations.
- Most of the CMS periodicals are published on a regular basis. Different from book citations, the date of a periodical identifies the issue. Therefore, the title of the periodical is followed not by a period but the date of the issue.
- MLA dates are stated in International Date Format: Day Month Year (without commas). Omit the day of the month if it is not a weekly or daily magazine.
- If page numbers are not consecutive use a plus sign to denote this, otherwise use the dash (23-45).

Example—

Ross, Timothy, Jason Richards, and Jessica Annise. "Living with Twins." *Parents Magazine* 5 May 1988: 56+. Print.
