



Newspaper Article, Subscription Database

- Many periodical articles do not provide the author's name. Omit the author of unsigned articles in periodical citations.
- Some database articles provide sample citations at the beginning or end of the article or in print setups. These citations should be re-formatted to be consistent with the guidelines and examples on this worksheet.
- Use the "n. pag." Plug-in if page numbers are not provided.
- This is subscription database article. Therefore, the title of the database has been added before the Medium designation and the Search date has been added to the end..
