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Answer NoodleBib Questions:

- Cite a Newspaper or Newswire (Pull Down Menu)
- Click Create Citation
- We think you mean... Newspaper or Newswire (Default, Do not change)
- Click Next
- Publication Medium? Print: Printed Newspaper
- Click Next
- An Article (Default, Do not change)
- Click Next

Fill in Only Appropriate Text Boxes:

- Use third column on chart on right to determine correct text box location
- Enter information for what is on your chart ONLY.

Upon completion of text box page

- Click "Check for errors" @bottom (Scan page)
- Click "Generate citation" @bottom to save citation

Printing Works Cited Page:

- While viewing List...
- Click "Save as Word Document" Button @top
- Click "Open and Print" hyperlink @bottom
- Save file to desktop, open file and print

NoodleBib cannot capitalize letters for you!*
