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**Answer NoodleBib Questions:**

- Cite a Web Site (Pull Down Menu)
- Click Create Citation
- We think you mean...Webpage or other Web... (Default)
- Click Next
- Describe the content? No content type applies (Default)
- Click Next

**Fill in Only Appropriate Text Boxes:**

- Use third column on chart on right to determine correct text box location
- Enter information for what is on your chart ONLY.

**Upon completion of text box page**

- Click "Check for errors" @bottom (Scan page)
- Click "Generate citation" @bottom to save citation

**Printing Works Cited Page:**

- While viewing List...
- Click "Save as Word Document" Button @top
- Click "Open and Print" hyperlink @bottom
- Save file to desktop, open file and print
